Title: Helping College Students Successfully Navigate the First Episode of Psychosis

Symptoms of psychosis often initially emerge during the adolescent and young adult years. University faculty and staff are likely to encounter early signs of psychosis or symptom manifestations of a psychotic disorder in the higher education setting but may not recognize such symptoms as early psychosis or know how to help the student successfully navigate mental health services in the community. This workshop will provide information on recognizing psychosis, explore the importance of accommodations in higher education, and describe how to best support students experiencing these symptoms using an evidence-based framework. First Episode Psychosis Programs across the state will be identified during the presentation. These programs provide strong case management and supported education support. The team is trained to effectively collaborate with college mental health providers to support and advocate for students as they maneuver through the higher education process. Team members are valuable community partners in helping students living with psychosis develop the necessary tools to increase their capacity to fully engage in their educational experience.
