

OHIO PROGRAM for CAMPUS SAFETY & MENTAL HEALTH

- Provide evidence-based training programs in collaboration with and for students and campus personnel to respond effectively to students with mental and behavioral health problems, such as depression and substance abuse, which can lead to suicide and suicide attempts.
- Train a student peer network to promote mental health, identify students in distress and refer to appropriate local resources.
- Create a networking infrastructure to link the institution with health care providers from the broader community who can treat mental and behavioral health problems.
- Create local college-based hotlines and/or promote linkage to the Crisis Text Line (Text 741-741) and the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline, 1-800-273-TALK.

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
